- Ralph Neville built this castle at the end of the 14th century.
- · He was responsible for the defence of this area against the Scots.
- · Richard Neville, Ralph's son, made the castle his headquarters.
- Following the death of Richard Neville the castle was granted to Richard, Duke of Gloucester, who later became King Richard III.
- · (astle Park was laid out in 1920.
